Alsterufer sinking



FONFA have been in contact with Tom Doležal whose father was F/Lt Oldřich Doležal seen in the photo below.



He was a pilot with 311 Sqn when they were stationed at RAF Beaulieu in 1943/1944. Whilst there he was responsible for the sinking of

the Alsterufer, , a German fast 2,729-tonne 'Blockade Runner' ship,

returning from Japan with a valuable cargo including 344 tons of wolframite – tungsten ore – bound for Germany.

This action took place on the 27 December 1943 and was considered the biggest success of 311 Sqn in WW2.

It is also regarded as the most significant action achieved by the Czechoslovaks in the RAF during WW2.
